#### From The Diary of St. Faustina

#### Meditation:

I saw Jesus, and from His Heart there issued those same two rays, which enveloped me, whole and entire. At the same moment, all my torments vanished. **My daughter**, the Lord said, **know that of yourself you are just what you have gone through, and it is only by My grace that you are a participant of eternal life and all the gifts I lavish on you.** And with these words of the Lord, there came to me a true knowledge of myself. Jesus is giving me a lesson in deep humility and, at the same time, one of total trust in Him. My heart is reduced to dust and ashes, and even if all people were to trample me under their feet, I would still consider that a favor (*Diary*, **1559**).

#### My Prayer Response:

Thank You, Lord Jesus, for the graces and mercy You have lavished on me. Without them, *I am nothing*, but with them and only with them, *I am a participant of eternal life*. May I live in this true knowledge of myself.



# **Eucharistic Revival**

By the consecration the transubstantiation of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ is brought about. Under the consecrated species of bread and wine Christ himself, living and glorious, is present in a true, real, and substantial manner: his Body and his Blood, with his soul and his divinity (cf. Council of Trent: DS 1640; 1651). (CCC 1413)



Before his Ascension Christ affirmed that the hour had not yet come for the glorious establishment of the messianic kingdom awaited by Israel1 which, according to the prophets, was to bring all men the definitive order of justice, love and peace.2 According to the Lord, the present time is the time of the Spirit and of witness, but also a time still marked by "distress" and the trial of evil which does not spare the Church3 and ushers in the struggles of the last days. It is a time of waiting and watching. (CCC672)

<u>'The Reality of This War'</u> Supreme chaplain visits the "hero cities" of Bucha and Irpin during his trip to Ukraine By Solomiia Karpiv 11/18/2024

During his recent visit to Ukraine, Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William Lori toured Irpin and Bucha, two cities that have become symbolic of both the brutality of Russia's invasion and the resilience of the Ukrainian people.

Russian forces seized Bucha, a town 18 miles (30 km) northwest of Kyiv, in February 2022. After they withdrew about a month later, several hundred civilians, including women and children, were found massacred. A mass grave near St. Andrew the First-Called Church held 119 bodies, and nearly 40 people were killed along Yablunska Street, where Russian soldiers established a headquarters.

On Oct. 19, Archbishop Lori visited the memorials that have been erected at both sites to learn about and pray for the victims.
