These times will be in place for the foreseeable future. A chaplain is in training at the Poor Clares Monastery which frees up Father Oscar for his duties at OLBS.





Consider Joining the OLBS Money Counting Team

After several years of serving on the OLBS Counting Team, several members are looking to turn in their calculators and take a well-deserved break from this weekly ministry for our parish. This ministry requires approximately 3 hours each week (usually Tuesday mornings) to sort, count and prepare our bank deposits for the weekly offertory collections.

Each team has a minimum of 3 members who perform this duty each week. These team members rotate each week based on their availability. Currently there are 5 members of the team who serve as a Lead Counter for the week with 2 additional members who help to count that week. We also have several members who serve as substitutes to fill in as necessary.

It is our hope that several of our parishioners would prayerfully consider becoming a member of the Counting Team. If possible, we would like to have enough interest to have enough members, to only require your covering 1 - 2sessions per month. We usually put out the schedule on a quarterly basis so that you can plan your availability accordingly.

Priests for Life

Baptism and Life

"Whoever is moved by love begins to perceive what "life" really is. He begins to perceive the meaning of the word of hope that we encountered in the Baptismal Rite: from faith I await "eternal life" - the true life which, whole and unthreatened, in all its fullness, is simply life. Jesus, who said that he had come so that we might have life and have it in its fullness, in abundance (cf. Jn 10:10), has also explained to us what "life" means: "this is eternal life, that they know you the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent" (Jn 17:3). Life in its true sense is not something we have exclusively in or from ourselves: it is a relationship. And life in its totality is a relationship with him who is the source of life. If we are in relation with him who does not die, who is Life itself and Love itself, then we are in life. Then we 'live'" - Pope Benedict XVI, Encyclical on Hope, November 30, 2007.

In November, a House committee voted to fast-track the following resolutions to amend Virginia's constitution:

- an extreme "right to abortion" amendment,
- an amendment to repeal the one-man/one-woman marriage provision, and
- an amendment to restore voting rights.


