Lent is associated with the <u>40 days</u> Jesus spent in the desert. This number, in turn, echoes several Old Testament events:

- The 40 days and 40 nights of the great flood. (Gen 7:4)
- Moses' 40 years as a shepherd in the desert before God called him to lead the Israelites out of slavery. (Acts 7:29-30)
- Moses' fast for 40 days and 40 nights on Mount Sinai before receiving the tables of commandments. (Ex 34:28)
- The 40 years the Israelites spent searching for the Promised Land. (Josh 5:6).
- The 40 days the prophet Elijah spent in the desert before meeting God on Mount Horeb. (1 Kgs 19:8)
- The 40 days that were given to the inhabitants of Nineveh before its announced destruction. (Jn. 3:4-5)

<u>Sunday Adult Bible Study:</u> We begin our study of Exodus. We meet after the 9 a.m. Mass in the front foyer of the hall.





Any child who has received their first Holy Communion is eligible to be an altar server. It is important to remember that participating in this important ministry also requires that you are able to show reverence throughout the Mass. That responsibility involves being able to sit still and pay attention to the Mass. It also involves showing respect by dressing appropriately – dress shoes, dress pants (no shorts), hair combed, etc.

#### **Priests for Life**

#### **Lent and Life**

"By our gracious gift each year, your faithful await the sacred paschal feasts with the joy of minds made pure" (Preface of Lent 1). The purpose of Lent is succinctly expressed by this preface.

Catechumens prepare for baptism into the paschal mystery. The faithful are reminded of their baptism, and will renew their baptismal vows at the Easter liturgy. Baptism initiates us into the eternal life Christ gives us. The baptized are sons and daughters of God and are members of the Church, the People of Life.

The choices of the baptized are therefore to be shaped by their new identity (see Rom 6:6; Eph. 4:17-24). Christ calls the Samaritan woman to repent as she accepts the waters of new life (see John 4:15-24). Lenten repentance is necessary so that God's people may more deeply become who they are. They are called to see their sins more clearly.

Hence baptism is known as "illumination."

Anyone who makes the Lenten journey is called to be more alert to the attacks on human life and dignity around them. The people of life are called to reject sin and all the devil's works and empty promises (Renewal of Baptismal Promises, Easter Liturgy).

The "pro-choice" and "right to die" mentalities are two of those "empty promises" which are firmly rejected by the baptized. A firm rejection of these positions is integral to repentance. Lent is the perfect time for us to call our congregations to a clearer understanding of why this is true, and to lead them to a deeper affirmation of life, both natural and eternal, in the celebration of the Paschal Mystery.

# From The Diary of St. Faustina Meditation:

Suddenly I saw the Lord interiorly, and He said to me, **Fear not, My daughter; I am with you.** In that single moment, all the darkness and torments vanished, my senses were inundated with unspeakable joy, [and] the faculties of my soul filled with light (*Diary*, **103**).

Satan always takes advantage of such moments; thoughts of discouragement began to rise to the surface — for your faithfulness and sincerity — this is your reward. How can one be sincere when one is so misunderstood? Jesus, Jesus, I cannot go on any longer. Again, I fell to the ground under this weight, and I broke out in a sweat, and fear began to overcome me. I had no one to lean on interiorly. Suddenly I heard a voice within my soul, **Do not fear; I am with you.** And an unusual light illumined my mind, and I understood that I should not give in to such sorrows. I was filled with a certain strength and left my cell with new courage to suffer (*Diary*, 129).


