


#### Jubilee Year of Hope

Altar server practice will be held on Sunday March

23rd immediately after the 9 am Mass. Each session will last approximately one hour.

New altar servers, and those who have not routinely served for more than a year, must attend BOTH sessions. There is a lot of information to cover, and we want to ensure everyone is well-prepared to participate in this important ministry.

Any child who has received their first Holy Communion is eligible to be an altar server. It is important to remember that participating in this important ministry also requires that you are able to show reverence throughout the Mass. That responsibility involves being able to sit still and pay attention to the Mass. It also involves showing respect by dressing appropriately – dress shoes, dress pants (no shorts), hair combed, etc.

The name of the Savior God was invoked only once in the year by the high priest in atonement for the sins of Israel, after he had sprinkled the mercy seat in the Holy of Holies with the sacrificial blood. The mercy seat was the place of God's presence. <sup>25</sup> When St. Paul speaks of Jesus whom "God put forward as an expiation by his blood", he means that in Christ's humanity "God was in Christ reconciling the world to himself." (CCC 433)

# From The Diary of St. Faustina Meditation:

September 25, [1937.] When I learned how great are the difficulties in this whole work, I went to the Lord and said, "Jesus, don't You see how they are hindering Your work?" And I heard a voice in my soul: **Do as much as is in your power, and don't worry about the rest. These difficulties prove that this work is Mine. Be at peace so long as you do all that is in your power (Diary, 1295).** 

The Lord said to me, It should be of no concern to you how anyone else acts; you are to be My living reflection, through love and mercy. I answered, "Lord, but they often take advantage of my goodness." That makes no difference, My daughter. That is no concern of yours. As for you, be always merciful toward other people, and especially toward sinners (*Diary*, 1446).

#### My Prayer Response:

Lord Jesus, in difficulties in my work and relationships, may I rejoice and do what is in my power with peace. May I always be merciful.

#### **Annunciation**

March 25, which is nine months before the celebration of the Birth of Christ, is the Annunciation, when Jesus was conceived within the body of the Virgin Mary as she accepted her call to be the Mother of God. The Magisterium's most comprehensive statement on the sanctity of life, the encyclical Evangelium Vitae, was issued on March 25, 1995. This feast marks the moment at which the Incarnation took place. At Mary's "Fiat," God began existing in a human nature - a human nature at the earliest stages of its development within Mary's body. "Mary's consent at the Annunciation and her motherhood stand at the very beginning of the mystery of life which Christ came to bestow on humanity" (Evangelium Vitae, 102). At a time when our society is beset with the evil of abortion, and when the human embryo is treated as a mere object for scientific research, the celebration of the Feast of the Annunciation is more important than ever. By celebrating this Feast with special solemnity, and by spending more time meditating on its doctrinal and spiritual lessons, the faithful can be even more solidly rooted in their pro-life convictions, and spurred on to effective action in defense of life. - ProLife Leader Frank Pavone, National Director, Priests for Life, EndAbortion.us
